



Choral Mentorship Program

After two very successful years, the Choral Project is preparing for the third year of its CHORAL MENTORSHIP PROGRAM. This program offers students who meet the entrance criteria and who exhibit the ability to rehearse and perform advanced choral literature a unique opportunity to perform with The Choral Project. Acceptance & Awards:

The Mentorship Program is open to all enrolled high-school students (grades 9-12). A maximum of eight students (two students per part: soprano, alto, tenor, and bass) per year are admitted into the program at the sole discretion of The Choral Project Mentorship Program Committee. All applicants will be notified in writing of their admission or non-admission. Each approved applicant will receive a \$150 scholarship at a concert performance on March 20 & 21, 2010. The concert marks the culmination of the program. The students will also be recognized in the program and during the concert performance.

Term:

Students will rehearse with The Choral Project for approximately 10 weeks. This schedule starts on January 11, 2010 and culminates with concert performances on March 20 & 21, 2010 at Mission Santa Clara and Holy Cross Church, Santa Cruz respectively.

Rehearsals:

Rehearsals are held on Monday evenings, beginning at 7:00pm and ending at 10:00pm at Le Petit Trianon, 72 North Fifth Street in San Jose. The program likely includes participation in part of the group's weekend rehearsals on January 23-24, 2010 in Los Gatos. Interns should reserve 9am-6pm on Saturday and 1pm-6pm on Sunday for the rehearsal. The exact schedule for the interns will be announced in early January.

Application Process

Please complete all the following steps of the application process. Applications need to be received by December 1, 2009. Those accepted into the program will be notified by December 15, 2009.

1. Fill out the enclosed application form.
2. Include a letter of recommendation from one of your music teachers.
3. Please write a short essay on how choral music affects your life. Why is choral music important to you?
4. Submit a 3-5 minute video that demonstrates your singing. You must perform with live accompaniment (no music tracks or taped accompaniment). Your singing should demonstrate accurate pitch, healthy vocal production, and expressive phrasing and performance.
5. You must obtain the consent of your high-school music teacher/administrator, and parent(s) or guardian (see application).
6. Incomplete applications will not be accepted.
7. Application materials will not be returned.
