The Choral Project wins 2nd Place in Mixed Choral Competition at the International Eisteddfod in Llangollen, Wales

LLANGOLLEN, WALES -- The Choral Project, San Jose, has won 2nd place in the Mixed Choir competition at the 58th annual International Eisteddfod. This is a significant achievement for The Choral Project, as over 650 choirs from around the world auditioned and only nine were chosen to compete. At the end of the competition, The Choral Project scored 274 out of 300, trailing the first place choir by only one point, an incredible accomplishment for the first competition that The Choral Project has entered in its eight-year history.

An International panel of judges adjudicated the competition awarding individual scores to each piece performed, and described The Choral Project's performance as a "very well chosen program." The Choral Project received the highest individual score of any performing group (95 out of 100) for its performance of the Karlsons "Neslegtais Gredzens", acclaimed by the judges as a "tour de force."

The competition was the culmination of The Choral Project's second International tour, performing in some of the great Cathedrals in Scotland and England. In keeping with its vision to "heal the world through music and words", The Choral Project performed in Baslow, England, benefiting the Village AiD Program, and gave a concert in Llangollen, Wales, for those who were physically unable to attend the Eisteddfod.
